For the opening concert of the season, Camerata's principal horn player, Naomi Atherton, takes centre stage to perform one of Mozart's favourite concertos, his *Horn Concerto no.4*. Two British string masterpieces are featured, Holst's ever popular dance-infused *St Paul's Suite* and Elgar's *Sospiri* (meaning sighs), a melodic work of tragic beauty, written in the build up to the First World War. There is also the opportunity to hear Haydn's *Symphony no.92*, nick-named the *Oxford*, a work brimming with invention and humour.

For the season finale concert, Manchester Camerata's principal players perform two melodic masterpieces of chamber repertoire.

Beethoven's *Septet in E flat major* is an endlessly charming and lyrical work. Hugely inventive and almost symphonic in scale, the Septet was one of Beethoven's most successful and popular works, transcribed for many different forces. Written almost 100 years later, Brahms' *Clarinet Quintet in B minor* was one of a number of late works inspired by his meeting with the clarinettist Richard Muhlfeld. Richly melodic and sublime. Enjoy!
